April 14, 2021**

Minutes

A meeting of the Board of Managers of OneCare Vermont Accountable Care Organization, LLC (“OneCare”) was held remotely via video and phone conference on April 14, 2021.

I. Call to Order and Board Announcements

Board Chair John Brumsted, MD, called the meeting to order at 4:32 p.m.

D. J. Saroyan joined the meeting at 5:00 p.m. and Dr. S. Kraft joined the meeting at 6:00 p.m.

II. Welcome Board Managers, Invited Guests, and Members of the Public

Chair Brumsted welcomed new Board Manager Rick Vincent, Executive Vice President and Chief Financial Officer at UVM Health Network representing the UVMHC Founders Seat and new Risk Strategy Committee member Dr. Dean French, CEO of Northwestern Medical Center.

III. Consent Agenda Items

The Board received Consent Agenda Items including: (1) Draft of OneCare Public Session Minutes March 16, 2021; (2) Board Committee Reports April 2021; (3) Financial Statement Package February 2021; (4) CMO Corner April 2021; (5) Public Affairs Report April 2021; (6) Summary of Policy Changes April 2021; and (7) 05-03 Network Development & Composition Policy. An opportunity for discussion was offered.

A Motion to Approve the Consent Agenda Items was made by M. Costa, seconded by S. LeBlanc and approved by a supermajority vote. Dr. J Saroyan and Dr. S. Kraft were not present for and did not participate in the vote.

IV. Governance

Chair Brumsted introduced a Resolution to approve Rick Vincent to serve as Chair of the Finance Committee, as a member of the Audit Committee, and as a member of the Executive Committee. Chair Brumsted described Mr. Vincent's qualifications and noted that he was recommended by the Executive Committee, which serves as the nominating committee, and by the Finance Committee. An opportunity for discussion was offered.

A Motion to Approve the Resolution Adopting Representative to Committees was made by T. Dee, seconded by D. Bennett and approved by a unanimous vote. Dr. J. Saroyan and Dr. S. Kraft were not present for and did not participate in the vote.

V. Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Discussion

Vicki Loner, Chief Executive Officer, introduced the ongoing diversity, equity, and inclusion work to include groups currently underrepresented in OneCare governance. Ms. Loner described that Management is working with consultant Stephen Graves of All In Consulting to hold paid focus groups with communities about their interest in participating in governance. Management will be contacting advocacy groups for Black, Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC) racial justice; for LGBTQ communities; and for people with physical and mental disabilities. Ms. Loner introduced Ginger Irish, Communications Strategist.

Ms. Irish asked the Board for their input regarding which advocacy organizations to contact to participate in paid focus groups, future DEI topics for board discussion, and DEI committee formation. The Board recommended outreach to mental health advocacy groups for focus groups and including health equity topics specific to the ACO or to the geographic region at future Board meetings. The Board recommended exploring ways to create a diverse work force at OneCare and discussed purposeful inclusion of racial justice and anti-racism in committee work. Several Board members expressed interest in joining the committee.

VI. Reducing Health Care Spending and Improving Health Outcomes Video

Amy Bodette, Director of Public Affairs, presented a short video explaining how OneCare reduces health care spending and improves health outcomes in Vermont. The Board praised the video's clarity in explaining the ACO and OneCare's work, recommended sharing the video with Patient and Family Advisory Committee, inquired about distribution of the video, and recommended consistency in the language used to describe the ACO's work.

VII. Public Comment

There were no members of the public in attendance.

VIII. Move to Executive Session

A Motion to move to Approve the Resolution to Move to Executive Session was made by S. LeBlanc, seconded by T. Dee and was approved by a unanimous vote. Drs. J. Saroyan and S. Kraft were not present and did not participate in the vote.

OneCare Board of Managers Committee Reports

May 2021

Executive Committee (meets monthly)

At its May 10 meeting, AHS Secretary Mike Smith and Director of Healthcare Reform Ena Backus joined the meeting to review and give feedback regarding OneCare's draft strategic plan. CEO Vicki Loner and committee members presented the plan and process to the invited guests. The committee discussed the IRS's recognition of OneCare as a 501(c)(3) organization operating for not-for-profit purposes, the All Payer Model Extension Task Force, governance, and nominations to the Finance Committee. The committee is next scheduled to meet on June 3, 2021.

Finance Committee (meets monthly)

At its May 13 meeting, members approved the March financial statements and April meeting minutes. Program Settlement, Participation Fees, Participant Fixed Payment, Value Based Incentive Fund, and Participant Appeals policies were reviewed and discussed. The committee discussed the 2021 CPR Policy Amendment and reviewed updates to the Finance Committee Charter. There was a brief update regarding the All Payer Model Program Extension Task Force group and that OneCare was recognized as a 501(c)(3) organization operating for non-profit purposes by the IRS. The committee discussed Medicare AIPBP claims processing. The Finance Committee meets next on June 9, 2021.

Population Health Strategy Committee (meets monthly)

At its April 12 meeting, the committee held a brainstorming session to discuss population health and telehealth, best practices, and the year in review. Helen Labun with Bi-State Primary Care, Sarah Kessler with the University of Vermont Health Network, and Hillary Wolfley and Catherine Fulton with the Vermont Program Quality in Healthcare, Inc. all presented a short synopsis to the group with time for comments and questions. Committee members held a round robin discussion on population health challenges for the future for 2021.

At its May 11 meeting, the committee was presented the Community Care Coordination Program Policy and was provided an interim analysis of the Care Coordination Program followed by time for questions and answers and committee discussion. The Population Health Strategy Committee meets next on June 7, 2021.

Patient & Family Advisory Committee (meets monthly)

At its April 27 meeting, CEO Vicki Loner discussed OneCare's strategic planning process and mission, vision, and values with the committee. Committee members discussed OneCare's recognition as a 501(c)(3) organization by the IRS, public affairs, and recent media coverage of OneCare. The committee had a robust discussion about the Care Coordination policy. The committee is next scheduled to meet on May 25, 2021.

Clinical & Quality Advisory Committee (meets bi-monthly)

This committee meets next on June 10, 2021.

Pediatric Subcommittee (meets bi-monthly)

The committee meets next on May 20, 2021.

Laboratory Subcommittee (meets quarterly)

The committee is next scheduled to meet next June 1, 2021.

Prevention and Health Promotion Advisory Committee (meets quarterly)

The Prevention and Health Promotion Committee met on May 4. OneCare gave an update about a renewed potential for a collaboration between the Vermont Department of Health and RiseVT on self-management initiatives to better serve patients with hypertension and diabetes. CEO Vicki Loner shared an update on OneCare Vermont's strategic planning process which will be finalized early this summer. OneCare gave an overview of the current and future work of RiseVT and introduced two new RiseVT program managers, Katja Evans at Gifford Medical Center and Jen Grant at Northern Counties Health Care, and highlighted the success of the Dinner Together program which has emerged as a successful statewide initiative. At the end of the meeting, the committee discussed avenues for connecting RiseVT's work with the clinical space specifically in reference to self-management programming and working with the provider community on weight-bias. While the next meeting is scheduled for August 3, this may be rescheduled to better fit the schedules of the committee members.

Audit Committee (meets quarterly)

The committee is next scheduled to meet on June 29, 2021.

CMO Corner – May 2021

1. **Health Service Area (HSA) Consultations** – The second round of meetings with each hospital leadership team began the week of April 5. A key emphasis of the meetings is to promote increased use of data available through OneCare Vermont to the network. The analytics department is committed to training local users of OneCare data tools. Updates are also provided concerning the 2021 Value-Based Incentive Fund Program, percentage of HSA attributed patients engaged in care coordination, financial incentives for engagement of “expanded cohort Medicaid attributed patients,” and year-end 2020 HSA financial performance.
2. **COPD/Asthma Learning Collaborative** – The next noontime didactic presentation to the collaborative participants and other interested network members will deal with the role of non-invasive ventilation in the treatment of advanced COPD and indications and principles of respiratory rehabilitation programs. Drs. Balachandran and Menson are presenting and the session will be held May 21 at 12:00pm. [Learn more and register here.](#)
3. **Project RETAIN (Retaining Employment and Talent after Injury/Illness Network)** – The Vermont Department of Labor was awarded upwards of \$21M from the United States Department of Labor to continue Phase 2 of this grant designed to improve patient care and reduce disability of those unable to work due to either medical illness or workplace-related illness or injury. Dr. Karen Huyck from the Dartmouth Hitchcock Department of Occupational Medicine is the principle investigator. The OneCare Vermont network has provided numerous practices to pilot care coordination interventions during Phase 1 and provided many letters of intent for the application to participate in Phase 2. The potential to reduce total healthcare expenditures for the ACO and to improve the quality of clinical outcomes for acute and chronic disease of attributed beneficiaries is a significant benefit to OneCare Vermont’s success. 4. **Accountable Care Learning Collaborative (ACLC) Peer Learning Series** – On April 26, OneCare participated in a national presentation describing the selection process of the Johns Hopkins Adjusted Clinical Grouper (ACG) and use cases for this tool at OneCare Vermont. The presentation was a follow up to a case study brief concerning risk adjustment in ACOs that they authored in 2019 for the ACLC. OneCare is a member of the ACLC, an organization founded by Governor Michael Leavitt (former Secretary of HHS under George W. Bush) which promotes best practices in accountable care entities.

'A crisis': Kids seeking mental health care are waiting for days in emergency rooms

In this article about the youth mental health crisis, OneCare is mentioned for having funded a pilot project to keep youth out of the ER. A quote directly from the article: "In 2018, United Counseling Service and Southwestern Medical Center in Bennington launched a Pediatric Urgent Care for Kids, an experiment funded by OneCare Vermont to keep youths out of the emergency room. The Bennington home reduced emergency department visits by 33% and could be a model for the rest of the state, Omland told legislators."

Green: Children in mental health crisis are Vermont's new public health emergency

- "...S.132, which gave the State Auditor the power to audit OneCare Vermont and required the Green Mountain Care Board to approve all health care provider contracts and determine how shared savings under the All Payer Model should be spent."
- "...S.120, which would create a task force to evaluate OneCare Vermont and examine ways to make health care more affordable for Vermonters."
- "VAHHS testified that while the All Payer Model and OneCare Vermont are trying to lower the overall cost of care through coordinated care and preventive care, real relief from high premiums and deductibles needs to come through examining the latest opportunities under the American Rescue Plan Act and changes to insurance plans."

OneCare Vermont obtains nonprofit designation

An opportunity that needs a good example to follow

In this editorial, Emerson Lynn provides his opinion on a bill passed by the Vermont House that, as Lynn puts it, “would use almost \$3.4 million of the stimulus money to explore the idea of ‘community schools’ a model that integrates a community’s social services into the classroom.” Lynn mentions RiseVT, the lead primary prevention program of OneCare Vermont, as an example of bringing services to improve student health into schools.

All-payer was supposed to change the way health care is paid for. Four years later, it hasn’t.

Government Relations

State Legislative Update

The State legislative session is rapidly approaching the end of the session with an end date scheduled for May 22. All the policy committees have wrapped up their testimony and bills have been voted out committee to the house/senate and the full floor. The money committees continue to work on the Big Money Bill (i.e. the State Fiscal Budget) which will include the newly received Covid Funding from the Federal Government. Senator Ginny Lyons comprehensive healthcare bill [S.132](#) was not voted out of committee and parts of the bill were inserted into other legislation including [S.120](#), the Healthcare Affordability Bill. On April 21, OneCare Vermont Chief Executive Officer Vicki Loner provided a letter to [the Senate Health and Welfare Committee](#) offering OneCare's positions on both bills.

On Thursday [April 15](#) and then again on Thursday [April 29](#), Ms. Loner also provided an "Introduction to OneCare" to the House Committee on Healthcare. The members of the committee were very engaged asking multiple questions over the course of 3 hours.

Green Mountain Care Board

At the April 7 Green Mountain Care Board (GMCB) meeting, GMCB staff presented an overview of their legislatively required report on "[Options for Regulating Provider Reimbursement](#)". The report provides a variety of options and is not meant to be recommendations. The options centered around three areas: 1) Regulating Health Systems Budgets, 2) Setting Reimbursement Parameters, and 3) Fee-for-Service Rate Setting. At its [April 7](#) meeting the GMCB heard from Ena Backus, the State Director for Healthcare Reform, who provided an update on the Vermont All Payer Model Implementation and Improvement Plan. The board was also provided an update on the Hospital Sustainability Planning that the GMCB Staff have been undertaken. At the May 5 meeting the GMCB was provided guidance by GMCB Legal Counsel on how to examine ACO Executive Compensation as part of the ACO certification process. Legal Counsel believes that as currently written, the existing language in Rule 5.00 provides the GMCB the necessary framework for the Board to consider executive compensation as part of the certification process. Vermont Public Policy and Advocacy Leadership Panel

Vicki Loner, CEO, and Dr. Norman Ward, CMO, participated on a panel about health care reform during the pandemic with Robin Lunge and Representative Lori Houghton on April 15. The panel was hosted by

the Vermont Medical Society and the Hanley Center for Healthcare Leadership. The panel provided an overview of Vermont health care policy and covered forums where health policy is developed, opportunities and effective methods for physicians to engage with the health policy development, and health care issues under active consideration in the public policy arena.

COLCHESTER, Vt. – OneCare Vermont (OneCare) has been recognized by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) as a 501(c)(3) organization operated for non-profit purposes.

OneCare filed an application with the IRS seeking 501(c)(3) status, in recognition of its commitment to supporting Vermont's health care delivery and payment reform efforts.
