

Identify and Support Potential Opportunities for Change

This map of Vermont and infographic describe the level of engagement for each health service areas (HSAs) and where there have been successes in using OneCare data.

The map of Vermont on the left shows each HSA's level of engagement rated from low to high. The HSAs with the highest levels of engagement are Brattleboro, Bennington, Burlington, and Rutland. Springfield, Windsor, Middlebury, Berlin, St. Johnsbury, and St. Albans have medium levels of engagement. Lebanon, Randolph, Morrisville, and Newport have low levels of engagement. The list of HSAs and their corresponding engagement level can also be found in the table below.

In the last six months, 15 organizations learned about the data-driven efforts that worked at other organizations in Vermont. As a result of these efforts, organizations are engaging around key focus areas identified by OneCare including:

- Care for chronic conditions
- Elder Care (geriatrics)
- Prevention (primary and clinical, more screenings, etc.)
- Access to care
- Utilization of service
