A meeting of the Board of Managers of OneCare Vermont Accountable Care Organization, LLC (“OneCare”) was held remotely via video and phone conference on August 15, 2023. Public access was also available at the OneCare Offices in Colchester, Vermont.

I. Welcome Board Managers, Invited Guests, and Members of the Public

Chair Wallack welcomed members of the public in attendance and offered the opportunity to introduce themselves.

II. Call to Order and Board Announcements

Chair Wallack welcomed Sandy Rouse to the Board as the newest elected Board Manager representing home health and hospice. She also discussed the release of the NORC report which indicates strong progress in the fourth year of the model.

Chair Wallack indicated that Managers are interested in occasional in-person meetings and management is looking at October at Central Vermont Medical Center. Managers should look for an upcoming email with details, including consideration of a new date and time for October.

The meeting was then paused as a quorum was not achieved until additional board managers could join the meeting. Board Chair Anya Rader Wallack called the meeting to order at 5:55 p.m.

III. Meet Vermont’s New Medicaid Director

Chair Wallack introduced Monica Ogelby, Vermont’s new Medicaid Director. Ms. Ogelby provided an introduction to herself and the Medicaid program in Vermont. Her position is situated within the Agency of Human Services (AHS) where she oversees and coordinates Medicaid policy across all departments at AHS as well as with the Agency of Education. Ms. Ogelby ended by describing her listen and learning orientation process and how she hopes to work with OneCare moving forward.

Sara Barry, Chief Operating Officer, provided the Board with a detailed review of the status of management's progress on 2023 corporate goals as of the end of the second quarter (June 2023). OneCare Board of Managers Committee Reports

September 2023

Executive Committee (meets monthly)

The Executive Committee nominated the following: a candidate for the Medicare Consumer Representative, redesignating an existing consumer seat to an ad-hoc board seat, a candidate for the final vacant ad-hoc Board manager seat, a new member to the Population Health Strategy Committee, and three new members to the Patient and Family Advisory Committee. The committee also discussed contracting strategy and the upcoming PY24 budget. The committee is next scheduled to meet on October 5, 2023.

Finance Committee (meets monthly)

At its September 13th meeting, the committee received updates on the 2022 financial audit and PY24 network participation. They discussed the 2024 budget, 2022 Medicare settlement, and AIPBP reconciliation. They also discussed aspects of the proposed Medicaid Global Payment Program pilot. The committee is scheduled to meet next on October 11, 2023.

Population Health Strategy Committee (meets monthly)

At its September 11th meeting, the committee discussed the Primary Care Mental Health Initiative, several waivers, and received an update on the 2023 PHM metrics. They also discussed the SDOH alignment meeting, the value-based care guidance document, and annual quality scorecards. Updates on program evaluation work and the upcoming data analytics platform transition were also provided. The committee is next scheduled to meet on October 9th, 2023.

Patient & Family Advisory Committee (meets monthly)

Committee did not meet in August 2023. The committee is next scheduled to meet on September 26, 2023.

Audit Committee (meets quarterly)

The Audit Committee met on June 30th. Earnest and Young was invited to the meeting and presented their findings from their 2022 financial audit. Pending any changes, the committee accepted the report and recommended it be presented to the Board when it is complete. Additionally, a compliance work plan status update was presented and approved. The committee is next scheduled to meet on October 30, 2023.

Asthma Smart Form

I designed and implemented the “Asthma Smart Form”. The asthma smart form is a clinical decision making tool in Epic, the electronic health record. The asthma smart form allows

clinicians to more easily adhere to the National Heart Lung and Blood Institute (NHLBI) Asthma Guidelines. Dynamic alerts appear to clinicians to indicate when medications should be increased or decreased based on assessments performed according to the NHLBI recommendations.

The asthma smart form automates completion of asthma action plans, another NHLBI guideline recommendations. Additionally, the asthma smart form also documents disease triggers, medication technique, patient adherence, and patient goals for the next visit. Data from the asthma smart form is stored longitudinally for clinical care, quality improvement and research.

I have presented this work at national conferences including the Epic Physicians Advisory Council and the Northern California Asthma QI Collaborative. Other organizations have sought to adopt the Asthma Smart Form.

Asthma Patient Education Videos

I was part of a team to develop patient education videos for patients with asthma. 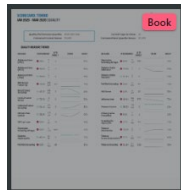

OneCare Vermont Accountable Care Organization Board of Managers Resolution Invoking Participation Waiver for Support of Clinical Coverage for Network Skilled Nursing Facilities

WHEREAS, there is a critical shortage of medical director and attending physician clinical services in Vermont Skilled Nursing Facilities (“SNFs”); and

WHEREAS, SNF level of care is essential for the effective function of a health care delivery system and the lack of medical director and physician services affects the entire delivery system; and

WHEREAS, lack of clinical coverage at SNFs can result in their inability to accept and hospitals’ inability to discharge patients who are not in need of acute care from inpatient settings; and

WHEREAS, OneCare has been working with a broad range of dedicated stakeholder partners in an effort to secure medical director and physician services for Vermont SNFs including: Vermont Agency of Human Services; Vermont Association of Hospitals and Health Systems; University of Vermont Health Network; Vermont Health Care Associates; Skilled Nursing Facilities of VT and individual providers; and

WHEREAS, the long-term stakeholder planning continues, and there is also a short term need for SNFs to have support in engaging clinical services; and

WHEREAS, OneCare allocated the sum of \$200,000 in its 2023 budget to be used to support SNFs; and

WHEREAS, OneCare has decided to use that budget to make payments of \$50,000 each to four SNFs in its network, requiring that the funds will be used to increase availability of clinical care in the facility; and

WHEREAS, OneCare has consulted with various stakeholders and reviewed available information to determine the four SNFs who are the most appropriate recipients of the payments in terms of need and impact on OneCare’s ACO Activities; such information including receipt by SNFs of emergency state funding, staffing levels, availability of coverage and census;

WHEREAS, this funding is a one-time occurrence, is not intended to be an ongoing source of funds, as the goal is for SNFs to be financially self-sufficient in funding medical director and clinical care in their facilities and OneCare remains committed to collaboration in co-developing medical services models to support Vermont SNFs; and



WHEREAS, OneCare participates in the Vermont All Payer ACO Model Vermont Medicare ACO Initiative and the Vermont Medicaid Next Generation Program. The Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services by and through CMS, and the Department of Vermont Health Access, have provided certain waivers of federal and state fraud and abuse laws in connection with the Vermont All Payer ACO Model (“APM”), the Fraud and Abuse Waiver Notice for Vermont ACO Initiative.

WHEREAS, The Participation waivers are available when, among other things, the governing body of the ACO has reviewed and determined that the arrangements are reasonably related to ACO Activities. ACO Activities include:

- Promoting accountability for quality of care;
- Promoting accountability for cost of care;
- Promoting accountability for overall care;
- Managing and coordinating care;
- Encouraging infrastructure investment;
- Encouraging investment in re-designed care processes for high quality and efficient services delivery;
- Carrying out any obligation or duty under the Vermont ACO Initiative or the Vermont Medicaid NextGen Program (together “Programs”);
- Direct patient care;
- Promoting evidence-based medicine;
- Promoting patient engagement;
- Reporting on quality and cost measures;
- Coordinating care with telehealth, remote monitoring and other technologies;
- Establishing and improving ACO clinical systems;
- Establishing and improving ACO administrative systems;
- Meeting Programs quality standards;
- Evaluating patient health;
- Communicating clinical knowledge;
- Communicating evidence-based medicine; and
- Developing standards for patient access and communication including via medical records.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Managers (the “Board”) of OneCare Vermont Accountable Care Organization, LLC (“OneCare”) as follows:



The OneCare Board of Managers has duly authorized the arrangements for OneCare to provide a one-time \$50,000 payment to each of the listed in-network skilled nursing facilities and has made a bona fide determination the arrangement is reasonably related to one or more of the above ACO Activities, including managing and coordinating care and accountability for quality, cost and overall care. Hospitals throughout the state are holding patients who do not need acute care in inpatient settings due, in part to a lack of nursing home capacity that has been limited as a result of lack of medical director and clinical services. Creating more capacity in SNFs will benefit the quality of care and cost of care for patients.

Therefore, the Board extends the protections afforded under the ACO Participation Waiver to the \$50,000 clinical capacity building payments to the following skilled nursing facilities:

1. Kingdom Kare
2. Suncrest Healthcare Communities
3. Mayo Rehabilitation Center
4. Helen Porter Health and Rehabilitation Center

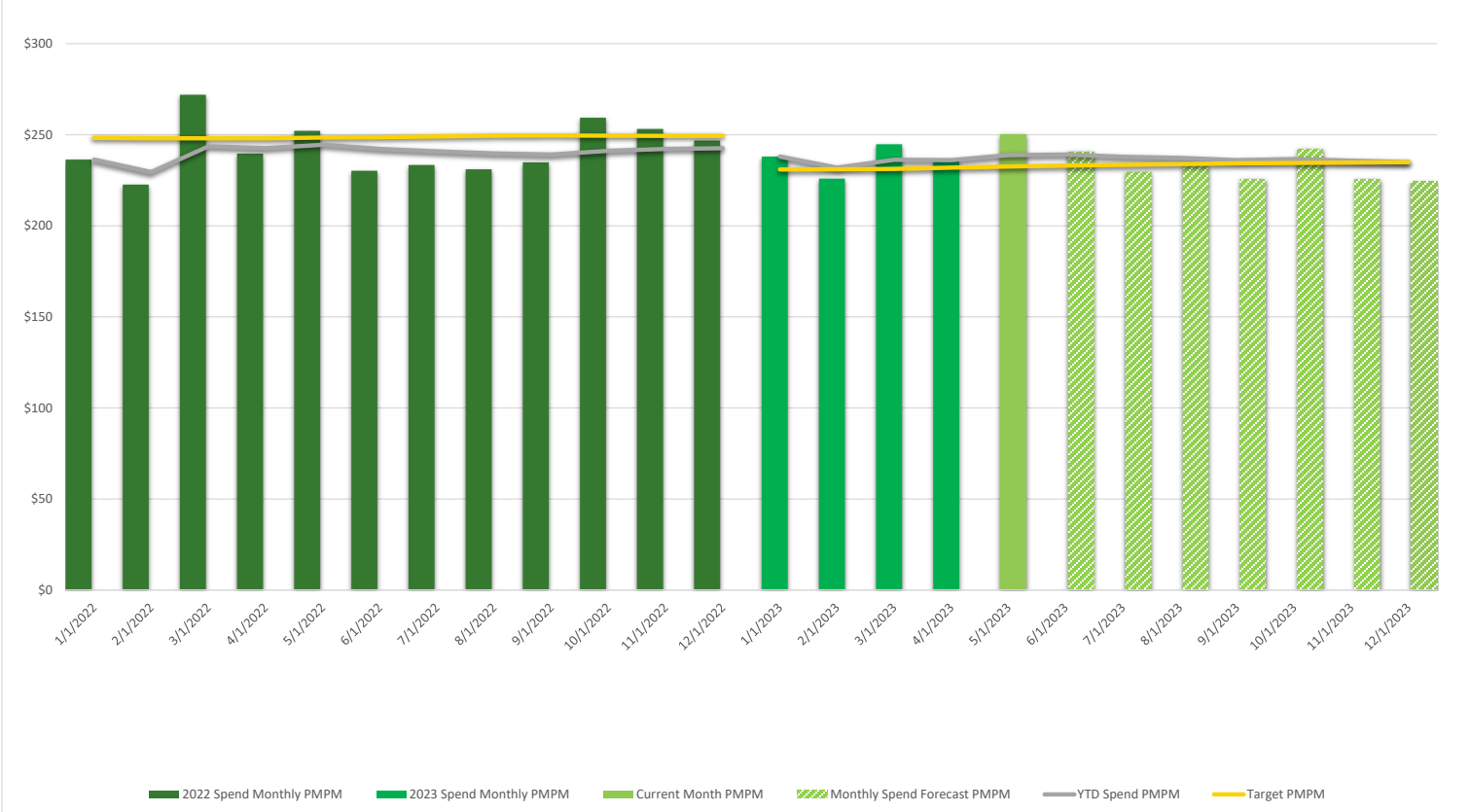

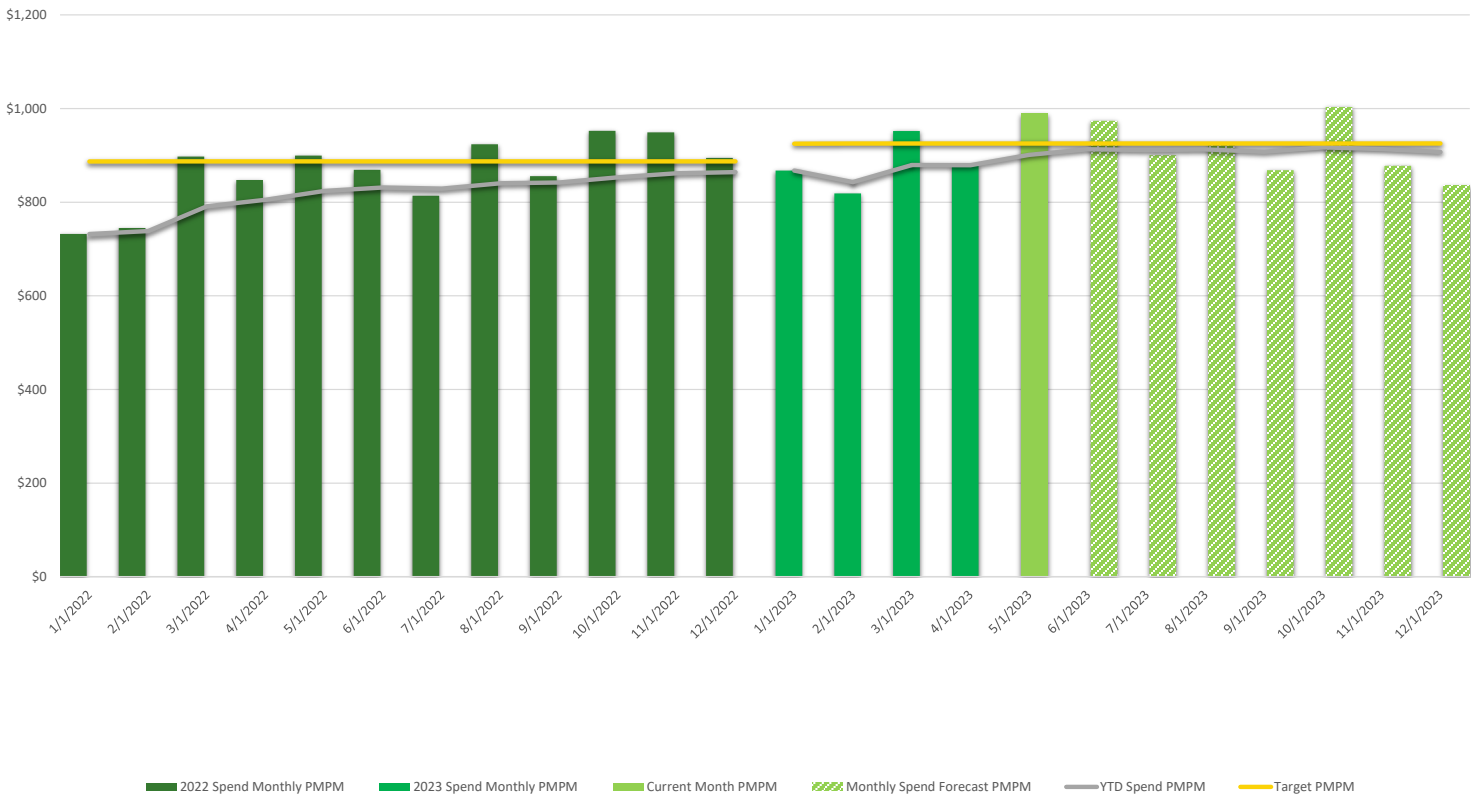

Update to the Board on the Mental Health Screening Initiative September 2023

Mental Health Screening Initiative

- In Program Year 2023, OneCare made approximately \$1.6MM available as part of a voluntary mental health screening initiative for primary care participants
- The initiative is aimed at improving mental health screening and follow-up rates in Vermont **and** expanding the electronic capture of mental health screening results and follow-up in support of statewide reporting
- The amount of the incentive is \$9.72 per assigned attributed life, paid in semi-annual installments
 - The first payment was issued in May based on an attestation from participating providers to comply with electronic reporting requirements in September and December
 - 79% of eligible practices attested to participate in the initiative (spanning 127k of 158k or 80% of eligible attributed lives)
 - OneCare is currently in the process of collecting YTD screening and follow-up rates and should be in a position to report on program compliance and performance by mid-October
- The initiative is supported by OneCare Policy 04-22-PY23 *Mental Health Screening Initiative for Primary Care Participants* and the OneCare Mental Health Screening Guidance Document
